



## Most common interview questions

- Tell me about yourself.
  - Provide general information like your current employment status, what you did at school or work prior to now, and give an overview of the type of person you are.
- Where do you see yourself in 5 years?
  - Highlight your interest in the job, your core strengths, and development of them.
  - Share your professional goals and where you'd like to be each year.
- What are your greatest strengths/weaknesses?
  - Focus on your knowledge-based skills, transferrable skills and personal traits as they relate to the job you are interviewing for.
  - Provide areas for improvement or areas you would like to grow your talents.
- Why do you want to work for us?
  - This is your opportunity to showcase what you know about the company and why it's a good fit for you and your skills.
- Why did you leave your last job?
  - Avoid negativity, be honest, and practice your answer.
- The 'hypothetical problem/crisis' question.
  - They are trying to identify how you think on your feet – provide an example of a situation or task, action you took, and results you achieved.
- What would your colleagues say about you?
  - What does the candidate think about how others view him or her? Are you self-aware?
- Why should we hire you?
  - Need to have an answer prepared in the event of this question. Brainstorm on how your background, skills, and abilities match up to the opportunities.
  - Structure your sales pitch and practice it.
